Genital examination for the early detection of cervical cancer

Breast examination for the early detection of breast cancer

Skin cancer screening for the early detection of skin cancer

Colon and rectal examination for the early detection of colorectal cancer

Every 5 years for women and men from 50 to 65 years	 Targeted, one-off comprehensive advice on the options for early detection of bowel cancer 	 Further examinations depending on age and gender
Annually for women and men from 50 to 54 years	Immunological test for hidden blood in the stool	
Every 2 years for women and men aged 55 and over	 As long as no screening colonosco- py has been performed, men and women aged 55 and over are 	entitled to a stool blood test every two years (as an alternati- ve to a colonoscopy)
2x at least 10 years apart for men aged 50 and over	 Screening colonoscopy If men only take up the colonoscopy offer from the age of 65, they are only entitled to a screening colonoscopy 	 From the age of 50, men can choose between a test for hidden blood in the stool and a screening colonoscopy, as men develop bowel cancer earlier and more frequently than women
